The **Recovery Movie Meetups™** program is an easy plug-and-play mutual support meeting format where your facilities screen a curated series of popular films about addiction and recovery, and then your clients engage in fun, dynamic and highly interactive group discussion afterwards - guided by the **Recovery Movie Meet-Ups Workbook**.

Each Workbook features film summaries on 20 key addiction & recovery-related films, movie trivia, character breakdowns, evaluation of each film's impact and relevance, and Motivational Interviewing-based questionnaires that participants fill out during or after the screening as homework to then share and discuss in subsequent meetings. It's a great way to motivate your clients to do more journaling.



The meeting format is not intended to replace any group meeting modalities you currently have in place. It's just an innovative, clinically-validated (see **Advisory Committee** below) new way to get your clients engaged, sharing, and thinking. There are no start-up fees or ongoing license fees, and no professional certifications are required. Free training is offered (2 hours online) and all staff who complete it will receive 2 ASAM Accredited CE Credits.

Recovery Movie Meetups are customizable for any size groups, billable to insurance, and only require a meeting host/facilitator, a common area with a TV, copies of the films (easily obtained on any video-on-demand platform) and the **Recovery Movie Meet-Ups Workbook** (pictured).

Workbooks help guide structured discussions at the meetings, and are the most powerful part of the program. Participants come to view a fully completed Workbook as an achievement in their recovery.
